Newington holds a successful Celebration Event on Wed. 13th December 2023

On Wednesday, 13th December, the Association held an event at the Lansdowne Hotel, Belfast to reflect on and celebrate the positive work carried out by the Association.

For many years we have continued to work in conjunction with our community partners, Tenant Forum members and others to deliver initiatives and project that can help support our tenants and those residing throughout North Belfast

At the event, the Association was delighted to also launch our new Tenant Participation & Community Involvement and Community Investment Strategies for 2023 – 2026.

Invited guests included members of our current Tenant Forum, key stakeholders and community partners, representatives from groups/organisations who were recently awarded funding via our Brian Mullan Community Fund and some Student Bursary awardees.

In total 16 groups/organisations who were awarded funding from our Brian Mullan Community Fund of grants ranging from £250 to £1,000 and there were six £500 student bursary awardees.

Speaking after the event, one of our Brian Mullan Community Fund recipients, **Eamonn Magill** who was representing Sacred Heart Boxing Academy said "I applied for the Brian Mullan Community Fund to help our local boxing club, Sacred Heart Boxing Academy. We are situated in the Bone area of North Belfast.

I received an award for the boxing club and was totally taken a back because I wasn't expecting this at all. The money awarded to us will help us in so many ways. This was the first ever grant I have applied for from Newington and to my amazement our club was successful.







A few weeks later I received an email and was invited to attend this event at the Lansdowne Court Hotel for the launch of Newington's Community Investment and Tenant & Community Engagement Strategies.

To be honest I didn't even know what this was about but because of their kind gesture I attended. I'm glad I did as it was an amazing event, which celebrated the great work of the Newington Housing and the wider community.

It also was a great opportunity for me to network with others from different organisations who are based locally throughout North Belfast.

Our Brian Mullan Community Fund





In October 2023, the Association was delighted to again welcome applications from community or voluntary sector organisations' seeking to avail of essential funding to deliver projects and services within North Belfast.

Our Brian Mullan Community Fund initiative has been designed to support organisations and projects that promote inclusion, strengthen communities and improve individual's lives.

A funding pot was again set aside this year by the Association's Board to ensure the successful delivery of this funding initiative.

Applications for funding closed on Friday, 3rd November 2023 and a total of 16 applications totalling £14,720 were received from various organisations throughout North

All qualifying applications were assessed by our 'Assessment Panel', made up of members from our Tenant Forum on 17th November, who distributed funding of up to £1,000 per project, to the successful applicants.

Due to the volume and standard of applications received, the Association's Board recently met and agreed to increase the funding pot from £10k to £15k and thus awarded funding to all the 16 groups/ organisations who applied.

The Association wishes to express our appreciation to all the organisations who took the time to apply for an award and we wish them every success in the delivery of their projects.

We also wish to extend our gratitude to our Forum members on the 'Assessment Panel', who gave up their time, on a voluntary basis, to help deliver such a successful initiative.

Newington's Student Bursary Awards 2023

The Association is delighted to confirm that we recently distributed twelve student bursary awards this year totalling the sum of £5,500.

Eight were awarded to new students, along with four renewals to existing awardees to help them financially during this current academic year.

We recognise that it takes real commitment from students and their families to continue and to remain in third level education and are mindful that for many families there have been significant challenges over the past few years as the cost-of-living crisis has undoubtedly impacted many within communities throughout North Belfast and further afield.

The financial burden placed on family members to support young people within a learning environment can be extremely challenging and we hope the financial support we provide will in some way help to reduce the pressures faced by many families.

Looking ahead, it is hoped that once the successful candidates complete their studies, they will return to North Belfast to apply the skills and knowledge they have learned, through their future professions.

On behalf of the Association, we wish to convey our congratulations to all the successful candidates and wish them every success with their studies.

Finally, moving forward it is the Association's intention to open the Scheme and invite applications for next year, late June 2024 and close them at the start of September, to coincide with the academic year.



Newington's Empowering Women's Skills Group

Work has been ongoing with Limestone/Newington women's cross-community project.

This group is made up of women from the Newington/Limestone and Tigers Bay areas, who have come together to form a women's group and to access training.

At the first training session, they got involved with Women's Tech. The group were trained in essential DIY around the home, including wiring a plug, changing a

fuse, mounting a shelf, and other home improvements and repairs.

This group bonded together so we decided to continue this as part of a Halloween and Christmas crafts group.

We are hoping to access some TBUC funding to develop the group further and look at further training including, exploring local history of the area.

Our next group will be a love yourself class in February, which includes stress management and healthy lifestyle and feel good-look good sessions.





Fundraising Events for 'Cash for Kids NI'

Newington staff took part in various events for Cash for Kids NI, including a sponsored walk and sponsored Christmas Jumper Day.

Staff and local residents arranged a collection of new toys which were delivered Cash for Kids NI warehouse in December, for distribution to families most in need.



Assets & Development News

Despite the challenges within the construction and maintenance sector, the Association is steadily progressing through and investing in our Planned & Cyclical Maintenance Program.

Since April this year, we have completed or are in the process of carrying out the following:

- Kitchen Replacements at various properties
 - o 54 Kitchens have been completed to date
 - o A further 9 kitchens are ongoing at present.
- Internal Redecoration at Camberwell Court Chat Rooms, Lisiuex House, 232 Limestone Road Works are ongoing and due for completion by end of February 2024.
- Condensation Issues and Remedial Works Various schemes are ongoing.
- Thermal Works at Indianna Ave Works are ongoing and due for completion by end of February 2024
- Ventilation System Servicing & Replacement
 - o Servicing element has now been completed.
 - o A further programme to upgrade units where required is still ongoing.
- Rain Guard System & Improvements Works have been deferred to 2024/2025.
- Internal Redecoration & multi-element improvements at Mater Dei Works have been deferred to 2024/2025.
- Ground Works at Kinnaird At feasibility stage to ascertain full scope of works required.
- Replacement of Window & External Doors All works have been completed.
- Gas Boiler Replacements at various addresses All works have been completed.
- Gas Servicing Works are ongoing.
- Electrical Inspections Works are ongoing.

Our Stock Condition Surveys

Our stock condition surveys commenced in November 2023 and are currently ongoing. These surveys provide vital information to us as an Association as they help provide data so we can plan for planned maintenance and major upgrade works to your home.

For example, this helps us plan for replacement kitchens, windows, doors ϑ heating systems etc. Our surveyors are currently making appointments with tenants and we would encourage you to arrange suitable appointments and let the survey take place as this will assist us with maintaining your home to a high standard.

During the financial year we have completed rehabilitation works to bring 4 properties into our stock profile at:

- 6 Greenhill Grove
- 25 Wolfhill Manor
- 26 Kansas Avenue
- 40 Clifton Drive

These properties have been delivered and finished to a high standard by our Contractor Bann Ltd and are providing much needed homes in the area.



Our Future Developments

Newington is constantly aware of the great housing need in North Belfast, and we are continually reviewing and seeking potential development sites within the area.

We are currently looking at feasibility of sites in the following areas:

- Ligoniel area
- Hill View area
- Turf Lodge area

Information about Secondary Heating Sources

Newington HA have taken the decision to ensure that open flues or multi-fuel / wood burning stoves have been removed or built up for health and safety reasons. Therefore, our properties should not have an open flue chimney or stove appliance installed.

We take our Tenant's and their families health and safety seriously and therefore, should you have or know off, an open flue / chimney / stove in your property, please let us know as there are various health and safety matters which could impact your health or even your life.

We wish to ensure that these are correctly installed and safe to use. We also need to check that the required smoke and carbon monoxide detection devices are installed to provide sufficient warning to the occupants should there be an issue with the chimney or appliance.

Should you have any concerns regarding open flue or chimney appliances please contact us and member of staff will be happy to assist

If you require a repair, when contacting the Association, please provide us with your correct contact details. Also when our contractors are due to call with you, please ensure you have made adequate arrangement for them to gain access. If you request a repair and you then fail to provide access, you will be requested to repay the Association the associated callout charge.

Boiler Service

The Association is still conducting our annual programme of cyclical gas servicing to all our properties. We appreciate all your assistance in facilitating access to our contractors. If anyone has not had their gas boiler serviced within the last 12 months or is aware that an engineer has recently called with them and failed to gain access (i.e. they have left a calling card with you), can they please contact the Association immediately?
